### 1 EAGLE OVERLOOK

*View of Navy Island, Canada*

Bald Eagles, Diving Ducks \* and many species of Gulls including Bonaparte, Herring, Ring-billed Gull and others.

### 2 BUCKHORN ISLAND

● North Shore ● Woods Creek ● Buckhorn Marsh

Tundra Swans, Peregrine Falcon, Diving Ducks\*, Osprey, Yellow Rumped Warbler

### 3 SCENIC WOODS

*Well kept trail, easy for young birders!* Perfect spot for viewing some of your back yard favorites including: Cardinals, Blue Jays, Black-capped Chickadees, Woodpeckers, and Juncos.

### 4 SPICER CREEK

*Short, paved trail through Spicer Creek Wildlife Management Area.* Diving Ducks\*, Woodpeckers, Bald Eagle Roosts, Golden and Ruby-crowned Kinglets, and Belted Kingfishers.

### 5 WHITEHAVEN OVERLOOK

Duck and waterfowl watching area - large rafts of Diving Ducks\*, and Geese in huge numbers frequent here.

### 6 EAST RIVER MARSH / FERRY VILLAGE

*Marsh land and trails with views of a number of waterfowl.* Great Blue Heron and Great Egret rookeries, Ring-billed and Herring Gulls, Eagles, and a variety of Diving Ducks.\*

### 7 BEAVER ISLAND WETLAND

● Beach and Shoreline ● Circle ● River Lea

Views of a number of different birds throughout the park including: Golden and Ruby-crowned Kinglets, Carolina Wren, White-Throated Sparrow, Bonaparte Gulls, Black-backed Gulls, Diving Ducks\* and Tundra Swans.

### \*Diving Ducks

Greater and Lesser Scaup, Canvasback, Red-headed Duck, Common Goldeneye, Bufflehead, Common, Hooded, and Red-breasted Mergansers, among others.
