

## LEWISTON POLICE BLOTER

The following activity occurred Monday, July 22, to Wednesday, July 31, as reported by the Lewiston Police Department. LPD answered more than 600 calls during this period. For more information on arrests and other activity, visit the Lewiston Police Department's mobile app or its page on Facebook.

### **Monday, July 22**

- **4000 block of Lower River Road, suspicious activity** – 911 caller reported four males outside the house. Patrols located males who said they were at the Joseph Davis State Park fishing docks. Subjects advised on park hours and left with no issues.
- **4900 block of Townline Road, MVA-property damage** – 911 caller reported hearing a loud noise and noticing a vehicle on the side of the road. Patrol said the driver struck a deer head-on; no injuries, animal deceased and no tow. NITEC notified for removal of deer; report taken.

the subject had fallen hard and struck his head. Juvenile did wish to speak with patrol; family member contacted to pick him up.
